The Art Exhibition Committee, made up of community members, art professionals and art faculty will review all submitted proposals. Each academic year, up to six proposals are accepted. Specific installation, reception, artist lecture and breakdown dates are dependent upon on the University Academic Calendar.

Submission Guidelines:

This call for exhibition proposals is open to all interested persons, including the students, faculty, and staff of Texas Wesleyan University. The application process is due on or before January 29, 2019. Proposals that arrive after January 29 will not be reviewed.

To apply:

- a) Submit a minimum of 5-7 images (jpg format, less than 5mb each) of original artwork that supports the proposal. These images should accurately represent the creations, expressive content and quality of art represented in the proposal.
- b) Provide a detailed description of the exhibition.
 - Incomplete and/or late entries will not be reviewed
 - State type of exhibition solo, group, or curated
 - Contact person name and contact information
 - Include a short bio and resume
 - You may request a time period be considered Fall or Spring
 - Artists or curators are responsible for installation and breakdown of the exhibition.
 - Artists must use the hanging system currently in place in the gallery
 - The artists or curator should deliver art ready to install. The gallery is not able to provide special or unique installation needs.
 - Art cannot exceed 7' x 4' and must be able to be carried by the artist
 - Three dimensional artists must provide their own pedestals
