


1902-1914

THE POLYTECHNIC COLLEGE YEARS



*Polytechnic College became Texas Women's College in 1914. Football ended with the cessation of male student recruitment.

Men were readmitted for the 1934-35 academic year. Football began in 1935-36. Texas Wesleyan would field competitive teams through the '30s and into early '40s under coach Gus Miller.



THE HALL SPLAWN YEARS


Halfback Hall Splawn was a campus legend during his time at Texas Wesleyan. Splawn, who died serving his country in World War II, led the team in many major statistical categories and was a team captain.

Texas Wesleyan wins a share of its conference co-championship and secures its place as an emerging football power. Games are played at Farrington Field. Texas Wesleyan's Student Government Association chambers hold the legendary championship footballs.
